Historic School Sites Recognition

It is the policy of the County of Warner No. 5 to recognize old historic school sites located within the boundaries of the County by placing a recognition sign at their former sites.

Guidelines

- 1. A written request/application must be received from the public by the County outlining the following information:
 - a. official name of the historic school site,
 - b. a brief history of the site which should include:
 - i. approximate date the school was constructed and in operation
 - ii. the date that the building was no longer used as a school, and
 - iii. any other history would be appreciated such as if the building became a community hall or was used for some other purpose.
 - c. the legal description
 - d. a letter signed by the current owner of the property approving that a sign may be placed on the property.
- 2. The application will be presented to County Council for their consideration to place a recognition sign on the property.
- 3. Upon receiving County Council approval, a sign will supplied and installed by the County and will be approximately one (1) foot square and will include:
 - a. the historic name of the school, and
 - the period of time it was operated as a school.
