ROAD AND TRAFFIC SIGNS

It is the policy of the County of Warner No. 5 to allow for the placement of traffic signs along public road allowances.

GUIDELINES

1. The County must approve all signs which are to be located within all road allowances.
2. The County is responsible for the supply and installation of general traffic signs as it deems necessary and these signs include, but are not limited to, Stop, Yield, Speed Zones, Texas Gates, School Bus Loading and others as may be required.
3. Standards of development and guidelines for the placement of traffic signs, as outlined by Alberta Transportation and/or provincial statute, will be considered and may act as a guideline, unless legislated, along with the specific needs of the area, for the location and types of signs to be erected.
4. The procedures for the approval of general traffic signs requested by the public are as follows:
 - a. A written request to the Bylaw Officer must be made for a sign. The request shall indicate the suggested wording along with the legal location for the sign to be placed.
 - b. The Bylaw Officer will inspect the location and determine the proper wording and indicate whether the sign is required or not.
 - c. If, in the opinion of the Bylaw Officer, a sign is warranted, the County will be responsible to supply and install the sign.
 - d. If, in the opinion of the Bylaw Officer, a sign is not warranted, and the applicant disagrees, he may appeal the decision of the Bylaw Officer directly to the County Council.
 - e. The decision of the County Council is final.
