Public Works Equipment Rates

It is the policy of the County of Warner that County landowners may request equipment related services for personal use at stipulated hourly rates for the equipment and manpower utilized.

Guidelines

1. Individual land owners may request the use of county owned equipment, such as a road grader, when the machinery is in close vicinity to the proposed property. Work which may be conducted includes maintenance of private lanes and snow ploughing located within the boundaries of the County of Warner No. 5.
2. Individual land owners may request the county to provide construction services on their property located within the County of Warner No. 5 boundaries. This could be to build driveways, dig dugouts etc. In order to receive this service the Public Works Superintendent will provide a quote to complete the project and a deposit of 50% of this quote would be required before the construction will start.
3. Individual landowners will be charged the current edition of the Alberta Road Builders and Heavy Construction rate for the use of the equipment for requests made by landowners. The first fifteen (15) minutes of work will be at no charge for the items referenced in clause 1.
4. Individual landowners may request the use of County owned equipment for farm yard cleanup purposes. The cost of this work will be invoiced to the land owner at the County of Warner Internal Rates which allows for the recovery of labour, fuel and oil costs. The cost shall be half the current edition of the Alberta Road Builders and Heavy Construction Association Rates. Equipment that is at a rate of \$50 or less will be billed the same rate as the current edition of the Alberta Road Builders and Heavy Construction Association Rates
5. The delivery of the service will be the responsibility of the Public Works Department and may be approved based on the Superintendent's discretion as to whether the project is reasonable and appropriate.
6. Each land owner shall be required to sign a "Hold Harmless Agreement" before any county owned equipment can perform any services on the landowner's property.
